I'm a one-time 306'er at Wendover, Utah - July and August 1942. Then three crews from each squadron were split off to join the 96th B.G. forming in Boise, Idaho. Young's, Hodson's and McKell's were the crews from the 367th Squadron.

The Feb 1995 issue of The Eighth A.F. News, page 16-17, pictured crews in front and on the wings of two B-17s was taken in Wendover in July 1942. I gave the original picture to "someone" in the 306th Group at the 8th A.F. Reunion held in Pittsburg. Somehow it got to the 8th A.F. Through our 8th A.F. - MN Chapter I tried to get the original, but the editor had lost it! Enlarged copies were made from the 8th A.F. News copy. I sent one to the Wendover Museum in 1996. I'd like to see if any of the original 367th personnel recognize themselves in vintage attire of 1942.

And Charles Schoolfield was our co-pilot (McKell's crew) from Aug - November 1942. Then he checked-out and got his own crew. I'd love to see him. Does he show up for the 306th Reunions?
