Burial services were held Monday, for former Waco Mayor and former Dean of Men at Baylor University, Travis DuBois, Jr. Mr. DuBois died Friday in Waco.

He was 66. Services were held at Columbus Ave. Baptist Church with burial in Waco Memorial Park. Rev. Ron Durham officiated.

Mr. DuBois was mayor in 1971. He served two terms on the council after being appointed to the council in 1967 to complete the term of the late Dr. Lloyd Russell.

During his terms on the council, Waco was in the midst of it's greatest building boom. As part of the Model Cities Program and a bond issue in 1967, the city constructed the Convention Center, Police and Courts Building, Fort Fisher, the Health Center and

Community Service buildings. Mr. DuBois was born August 20, 1923, in Eddy. He graduated from Bruceville-Eddy High School and was inducted into the Army Air Corps. He was stationed with the Eight Air Force in England during World War II and flew 35 combat

missions over Europe. He returned to Texas and married Betty Jean Deviney in 1949. He graduated from Baylor University in 1949 with a degree in education and returned to Baylor to earn a Master of Science in Education degree in 1952.

Dr. DuBois served as principal of elementary schools in Fort Abbot. He then returned to Waco as director of Brookwood dormitory. He also served as Penland Hall.

Former Waco mayor, Baylor dean dies at 66

Travis DuBois Jr., a former Waco mayor and former dean of men at Baylor University, died Saturday in Waco. He was 66.

Services will be at 10 a.m. Monday at Columbus Baptist Church.



men's dormitory, in 1956. He was named assistant dean of men in 1958 and dean of men in 1962.

Mr. DuBois was appointed to the Waco City Council in 1967 to complete the term of the late Dr. Lloyd Russell. He served two regular two-year terms in 1968 and 1970. He was appointed mayor of Waco in 1971.

Mr. DuBois retired from Baylor University on Aug. 31, 1988, after also serving as director of facilities and inventory, security, and the recreation center.

He was the former president of the Southwest Association of Student Personnel Administrators. He was a member of the Association of University Housing Officers and the National Association of University Traffic and Directors, and Columbus Baptist Church.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Travis DuBois III of Waco; one daughter, Ann DuBois of Waco; two brothers, Bert Marcus Christi and ...
