Dear Russell:

I found the orders assigning me to the 423rd and the orders transfering me to the 2nd Evacuation Hospital and copies are enclosed. The orders assigning me to the 423rd referred to a VOCO from the HQ, 11th CCRC so I assume that there were no written orders assigning me or my crew to the 306th. The VOCO was May 8th and the orders were dated May 9th 1943 which I assume was the day we reported to the 306th.

I am enclosing a copy of the only orders I have relating to my crew assignment to 8th Air Force dated 1 March 1943. I thought you might find them interesting in as much as the orders also include several crews which were assigned to the 306th.

After leaving the hospital I was assigned to First Bomb Division on 1 November 1943 and a copy of the orders are enclosed confirming the VOCG dated 29 November 1943. Of interest are the number of personnel from the various Groups included in the orders. This leads me to believe that most of the orders were issued out of the Division HQ rather than Group HQ. It also appears that there may have been lots of VOCO's.
