It was nice to talk with you this evening--one more 306'er run to earth.

As I said then, the 306th will have a reunion Oct. 15-17 in Dayton, featuring the Air Museum. The first reunion was held last October as a part of the first 8th AF reunion at Miami Beach. The 306th had the largest attendance, 45. I didn't know a one of them overseas, but everyone had a great time.

We have now located all of the group c.o.'s, most of the squadron c.o.'s, and quite a group of other officers and men and from all aspects of the group.

I would appreciate it very much if you would complete the enclosed form, adding any mission details which are significant. This is one of the ways I have of trying to piece together the story of the group. Perhaps you also have some clippings or other printed pieces, or know of things, that I might be able to use.

I'll follow up the David McGee lead in Colliers.

I am also interested in getting copies of any Special Orders which you may have. During this period they were not required to be saved and have evidently all disappeared. I have them from December 1943 on through the rest of the war.

Any current addresses, or leads of any kind on other crew members or persons you knew in the 306th would be appreciated in our continuing search for the many whom we have not yet found.

I'm sorry that I hadn't located you before my trip through Winchester, or I might have paid you a visit instead of a call.

Oh, if you have any interesting pictures from England I would like a chance to look at them and perhaps have them copied.

A SURFACED SUBMARINE AT ABOUT 1,000 - 1500 FT. I STRAFED IT WITH MY NOSE GUN THEN PASSED IT TO VIC ROSE, OUR BALL TURRET GUNNER. I ENJOYED SEEING GERMAN CREW MEMBERS JUMPING INTO THE WATER. WE SAW GERMAN FIGHTERS SHOOTING AT OUR FORMATION AS THEIR WHEELS CAME UP ON BREST AIR FIELD. WHEN THEY ATTACKED AS WE HEADED OUT TO SEA MACHINE GUN BULLETS HITTING OUR FUSELAGE SOUNDED LIKE RAIN ON A TIN ROOF. JOHN ROLLER, OUR WAIST GUNNER, WAS SERIOUSLY HIT. AFTER ADMINISTERING FIRST AID BY INJECTING MORPHINE, I MANNED THE TAIL GUN POSITION WHICH HE HAD BEEN FILLING THAT DAY. WHEN WE LANDED AT THE FIRST AVAILABLE BASE OUR CREW WAS PLEASED JUST TO BE ALIVE.

IT WAS NECESSARY TO LEAVE OUR PLANE THERE AND CATCH A RIDE BACK TO THURLEIGH. SINCE MY GUNS HAD GOOD BARRELS I TOOK THEM WITH ME. THINKING I WAS DOING OUR SQUADRON A FAVOR, INSTEAD I CAUGHT SOME FLAK FROM LT. ARONSON, OUR SQUADRON ARMAMENTS OFFICER. IT SEEMED MY VOLUNTEER ACTION DEPRIVED HIM OF SECURING NEW REPLACEMENT BARRELS. ALL IN ALL IT WAS A VERY INTERESTING DAY.

court-martial in Korea.


Upon return to active duty in December '48

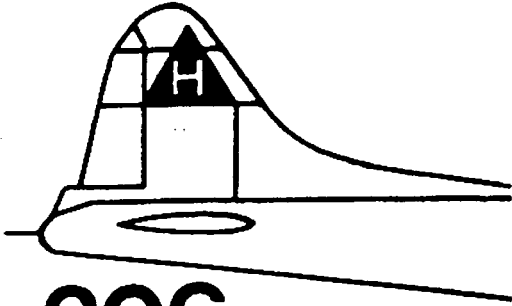
