Dear Mr. Strong:

I am sorry for all of the trouble caused by my less than complete request for mission reports. Unfortunately I did not fly with the 306th - I didn't come along until 1950 - but I have always had a deep interest in the Army Air Corps in World War II and ever since I can remember the B-17 has been my favorite of all of the aircraft to see action in WWII. Since I learned that a friend of mine flew with the 306th and have heard stories of many of his experiences I guess that I have adopted the 306th as "my" group.

The person I am interested in is Charles O. Holt Jr., who flew with the 306th from September 1944 thru January of 1945. 2nd. Lt. Charles O. Holt Jr. flew as Bombardier on the crew of 2nd. Lt. William T. McCaulie, crew AJ-5, with the 368th Bomb Squadron. Charles flew as Bombardier / Navigator with several different crews and as a result was the first member of the McCaulie crew to finish 35 missions.

I am trying to acquire enough information about the missions flown by Lt. Holt to write some stories about them and possibly work them into a book. I have learned much about many of these missions through your book, First Over Germany, all of the 306th Squadron Diaries, and many other books that I have read. I would be very interested in knowing what information is available from the 306th Bombardment Group Association and its cost. Also any advice on gathering information about these missions would be greatly appreciated.

I have enclosed some photographs of 306th aircraft that I thought you might like. I made them from photos that Charles gave me, I have a few more but have not had time to print them yet - photography is a hobby of mine. AWARDS OF DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS

Under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended and pursuant to authority contained in letter, Hq Eighth Air Force, File 200.6, 23 September 1944, subject, "Awards and Decorations," the DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS is awarded to the following-named Officers and Enlisted Men.

% WARREN T. SMITH, O-705633, First Lieutenant, Air Corps, United States Army. For extraordinary achievement while serving as Pilot of a B-17 airplane on a bombing mission over Germany, 26 November 1944. On this date the aircraft which Lieutenant Smith was piloting was subjected to concentrated attacks by hostile fighters. The airplane was hit by 20 mm. cannon fire before reaching the objective, causing the bomb bay doors to fall open and one of the bombs to be salvoed. The bomb release mechanism was damaged forcing the four remaining bombs to hang up. The Tail Gunner was wounded and a fire behind the Number Two engine was started. In a second attack by the enemy aircraft, the airplane sustained hits behind the instrument panel, knocking out the artificial horizon and the left wing was damaged. With the fire burning rapidly and enemy fighters still attacking, Lieutenant Smith held the airplane in formation and ordered the bombs to be jettisoned. After attempts to extinguish the flames proved useless Lieutenant Smith maneuvered the aircraft clear of the formation and initiated the return flight alone. The fire persisted for almost three hours despite the efforts of the crew to control it. Evincing the utmost determination and ability, Lieutenant Smith effected the return flight to England where a crash landing was accomplished without further injury to the crew. The courage, coolness and tenacity of purpose displayed by this officer on this occasion reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from South Dakota.

X CHARLES O. HOLT, JR., O-557538, Second Lieutenant, Air Corps, United States Army. For extraordinary achievement while serving as Bombardier and Navigator of a B-17 airplane on bombing missions over Germany and German occupied countries, from 1 September 1944 to 7 January 1945. Throughout these operations Lieutenant Holt exhibited a high degree of proficiency, contributing materially to the success which was attained by the formations in which he flew. On 2 November 1944 the aircraft, in which Lieutenant Holt was flying as Bombardier sustained damage to the Number Two engine and the oxygen system, and the airplane was forced to lose considerable altitude. Despite the numerous difficulties Lieutenant Holt remained at his position, dropped the bombs on the assigned target and assisted the Navigator in guiding the airplane back to base. On 31 November 1944 the aircraft became separated from the formation because of extremely poor visibility after the bomb run. Lieutenant Holt, serving as Navigator, was unable to use pilotage because of the dense cloud cover. Employing dead reckoning navigation he skillfully guided the airplane to home station, meticulously avoiding heavy concentrations of antiaircraft fire. On 11 December 1944 accurate flak disabled the oxygen system of the aircraft and forced the Pilot to descend to a lower altitude. Lieutenant Holt charted a course and navigated the airplane along the return flight to base without further incident. The courage, coolness and skill displayed by this officer on all these

occasions reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from Missouri.

RAYMOND A. VICHA, 37312855, Staff Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For extraordinary achievement while serving as Waist Gunner of a B-17 airplane on bombing missions over Germany and German occupied countries, from 6 May 1944 to 24 December 1944. Throughout these operations Sergeant Vicha demonstrated outstanding ability and an exemplary devotion to duty. On all the missions in which he participated he consistently rendered exceptional services in the performance of his tasks. He has flown to heavily defended targets deep in Germany and through his expert gunnery assisted in warding off enemy opposition and in maintaining the integrity of the formation. Sergeant Vicha served with distinction as a crew member of the lead aircraft of a Bombardment Group and Bombardment Squadron on numerous missions, attaining a high degree of coordination with other personnel. On several missions the formation in which Sergeant Vicha was flying was subjected to vicious attacks by hostile aircraft. Fighting from his gun position he aided in achieving maximum fire power and in successfully repelling the enemy fighters. The courage, coolness and skill displayed by this soldier on all these occasions reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from North Dakota.

CHARLES H. BORLAND, 19095538, Staff Sergeant, Air Corps, United States Army. For extraordinary achievement while serving as Tail Gunner of a B-17 airplane on bombing missions over Germany and German occupied countries, from 8 June 1944 to 24 December 1944. Throughout these operations Sergeant Borland demonstrated a high degree of proficiency and an exemplary devotion to duty. His actions on these occasions contributed significantly to the success of numerous important missions against the enemy. In the face of vicious enemy resistance from fighter attacks and antiaircraft fire he performed his duties with distinction. On 10 September 1944 the aircraft in which he was flying was badly damaged by flak in the vicinity of the target. One oxygen system was destroyed; the Number Four engine was set on fire, and the hydraulic system was damaged. The Pilot gave the order to bail out and thinking the crew had done so left the airplane. Five crew members failed to hear the signal. Demonstrating exceptional initiative and calm resolution, Sergeant Borland proceeded to the cockpit and expertly assisted in piloting the airplane back to friendly territory, where the remainder of the crew bailed out. The inspiring resourcefulness and unusual determination evinced by this soldier contributed materially to the safe return of several of the personnel. The courage, coolness and skill displayed by Sergeant Borland on all these occasions reflect the highest credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States. Entered military service from Washington.

TO : Commanding Officer, 360th Bomb Sq (H), APO 557, U. S. Army.

1. It has come to my attention that the 360th Bombardment Squadron (H) has accomplished a total of fifty-seven (57) consecutive heavy bombardment operations against the enemy without loss of aircraft or crew from 25 May 1944 to 26 August 1944.

2. The 360th Bombardment Squadron (H), has, during this period, dispatched five hundred and fifteen (515) B-17 aircraft and four thousand six hundred and thirty-five (4,635) officers and enlisted men to attack enemy installations. Despite determined enemy opposition, twenty-eight (28) targets in Germany, twenty-six (26) in occupied France and three (3) in occupied Belgium were bombed with eight hundred and seventy-seven (877) tons of high explosives and ninety-five (95) tons of incendiaries. The accurate bombing performed by this unit on 18 July 1944 at Peenemunde, Germany and on 4 August 1944 at Anklam, Germany, contributed much to the success of these operations.

3. I desire to commend participating combat crews for their demonstration of exemplary flying skill and teamwork in attaining this excellent combat record and also all personnel engaged in the administration and maintenance of the 360th Bombardment Squadron (H), for their untiring efforts given in close support of these operations.
