I don't know the exact day I was assigned to the 306th? But my first flights at Thurleigh started on May 30th, 1943.

I am very grateful to those responsible for the 306th Echo and I am enclosing a donation to help further this publication and please get this in the proper hands.

Please be sure to include me on your list to receive the updated 367th Combat Diary when it is ready.

Also, I have never been able to find a Missing Air Crew Report for your crew, hence I put together the one which is in your set.

A short paragraph in the 367th Combat Diary does list your crew after you were shot down, and states that this was the Groupås first venture into Happy Valley, The Ruhr.

I would appreciate receiving from you any details concerning you and your crew from the time you realized you were in trouble, the bailout, landing, capture, etc.

Several times I have thought I had located Hardie Dunn, I guess you and Ed Gast are the only ones from your crew on our mailing list.

Dear Russell Strong,

In the 97-98 Issues of the 306th Echoes I was unable to find my flight engineer's name listed among those killed in action. I am hopeful some of your records might show if his body was recovered and if so where he might have been buried.

TSgt. L. B. Hansen was assigned to my crew from the beginning training in early January '43, and flew with our crew to England to the 306th bomb group. We were shot down June 22, 1943 on the raid to Huls, Germany after we left the target. Sgt Hansen was wounded and went down with the ship.

The German interrogator told me that one body was found in the wreckage several days later, also that one 500 pound bomb had exploded on impact.

I am unable to supply any other details about the sergeant such as serial numbers and so forth, but I would appreciate any information as it has been a long time question for me.

I am enclosing a contribution towards the continuation of The Echoes. Please keep up the good work Thank you for your time.
