Dear Ed:

At one time we had a source inside the Veterans Administration who gave us real help on finding "lost" 306th people, but he has retired, like most of us.

Do you know where Paul Q. Chapman came from?

If so, that would be of great help in trying to locate him.

Other t-han that, there isn't much we can do. Publishing such names in Echoes, without some point of reference, has proven to be of little or no value.

If you can find his home town, or know where he may have gone to college, let me know, and I'll work on it a bit. Through such leads we have had fair success in finding people, although I have a list of more than 800 people whom we have been unable to turn up anything.

The 306th, as near as I can tell, had about 10,000 men in it over the wartime period. We now have 2250 on our mailing list. We know that 750 were KIA, and many have died since the war. But we are still finding more than we are losing, so the list continues to grow.

Perhaps you have hometowns for others of your crew members who are not already on the mailing list. Or, you may know what POW camps they were in. I have access to other lists and information, and will be happy to search any of these routes.

Let me hear from you soon.
