Dear Mrs. Strong.

This is to inform you that John G. Miller Jr died Nov. 20-01.

He was a T/Sgt. radio operator and gunner on a B17 flying with the 306th Bomb Group - 367th Bomb Squadron.

He was shot down on April 24, 1947 in a raid over Oberpfaffenhofen, Germany.

He was interned in Alderheide Switzerland for ten months when the Allies freed France they were repatriated.

He is survived by his wife Elvira, son, four grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

He retired in 1988 as a supervisor at a plant that made simulators for the army.
