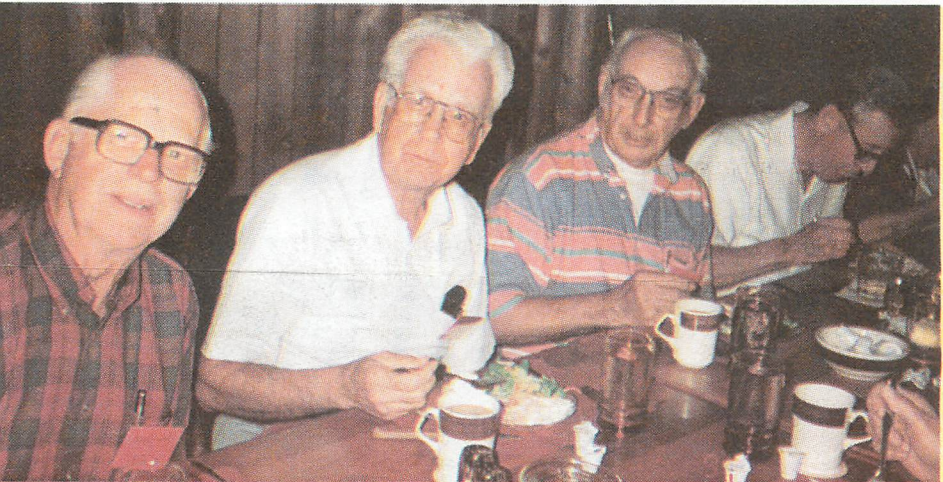

### Dr. Robert B. Morrow

NEWPORT — Dr. Robert B. Morrow, 73, who served the Newport area as a family physician for 31 years, died of natural causes on Monday March 18, in Lincoln City, Ore., while on vacation.

He was born on Dec. 12, 1922, in Anaconda Mont., to Bayard and Jessie (Rowten) Morrow.

He attended the University of Idaho and the University of Oregon, where he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in biology. After receiving his Medical Degree from the University of Oregon Medical School in Portland in 1953, he went on to serve his internship at Deaconess Hospital in Spokane and his residency in Tulare, Calif.

He married Johanna Flood on Aug. 28, 1954, in Portland, Ore. In 1955 they moved to Newport, where he worked in private practice for 31 years until retiring in 1986. For the last 10 years of his practice, he was in partnership with Dr.

Peter Weir.

"He was my family doctor for 10 years when I was growing up, he was my mentor and role model — and for 10 years he was my partner," Weir said last week. "He was the most conscientious and hard-working physician I've ever known. Once people got to know him, they loved him — his patients thought he walked on water."

Weir added that Morrow's offer of partnership was a "big break" for Weir. For several years, Morrow, though not the only doctor in town, did have a solo practice, and was on call seven days a week — even making house calls. Weir also said that when Morrow had a very ill patient, Morrow would spend all night at the hospital bedside in case he was needed.

"He was the old country doctor — the epitome of what rural family physicians were," Weir said.

Morrow's involvement in the community also included attending the American Lutheran Church, and he was a member of both the Beta

Theta Phi and the TKP Fraternities.

Surviving are his wife, Johanna F. Morrow of Newport; one son, Robert Bruce Morrow of Seattle; two daughters, Kimberly M. Gaffney of Bozeman, Mont., and Tracey Morrow of Denver, Colo.; one brother, James B. Morrow of Missoula, Mont.; and two grandchildren, Kyle B. Gaffney and Austin M. Gaffney, both of Bozeman, Mont.

Memorial Services are pending, with Pacific View Memorial Chapel in Lincoln City handling the arrangements.
