

DR. HAROLD D. MUNAL

Well-known San Juan physician, Munal dies

SAN JUAN — Dr. Harold
Dean Munal died at his residence in San Juan on Saturday,
at the age of 76 after a lengthy
illness.

He was a well known and respected physician in San Juan for many years.

He graduated from high school in Memphis, Tennessee, and attended Kansas State College, the University of Tennessee and Southern Methodist University. He received his M.D. from Baylor Medical School in 1940.

He attended the School of Aviation Medicine at Randolph Field following which he was assigned the 306 Bomb Group (H) and served in the European Theater of Operations. He was awarded the ETO ribbon and six battle stars, the Bronze Star for meritorious service, and a Presidential Citation.

After his release from the Air Force, Dr. Munal came to San Juan, where he was in active practice from 1946 until 1985. At that time he moved his practice to McAllen until his retirement in December 1987. He was a charter member of the

American Academy of General Practice and past president of the Hidalgo-Starr Counties Medical Society. He held a fellowship in the American Gereatrics Society since 1959.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Rutherford; two sons, Harold Dean Munal and Jamie Rutherford Munal and five grandchildren; and one sister, Mrs. Lillian Hensley of Dallas,

Funeral services will be conducted Monday at Kreidler Funeral Home on N.10th in McAllen. Officiating will be Rev. Keith Wyatt. Burial will follow at Valley Memorial Gardens.

DR. HAROLD D. MUNAL

Well-known San Juan physician, Munal dies

SAN JUAN — Dr. Harold
Dean Munal died at his residence in San Juan on Saturday,
at the age of 76 after a lengthy

He was a well known and respected physician in San Juan for many years.

He graduated from high school in Memphis, Tennessee, and attended Kansas State College, the University of Tennessee and Southern Methodist University. He received his M.D. from Baylor Medical School in 1940,

Aviation Medicine at Randolph-Field following which he was assigned the 306 Bomb Group (H) and served in the European Theater of Operations. He was awarded the ETO ribbon and six battle stars, the Bronze Star for meritorious service, and a Presidential Citation.
