At the time I was shot down and taken prisoner, I was not flying with my regular crew. I took the tail gunners position on another plane. Ex-Pow Stalag 17B

From NY we flew to England. Toured England a few days then took the train from London to Bedford where we were met by John Mills. We spent 4 days with John and his wife Di - Lovely people.

Jim Vaughter, was the bombardier on the plane I was flying with (as a tail gunner) when we were shot down over Germany, following our Raid on Schweinfurt. Our mission was to destroy the ball bearing plants - Oct 14, 1943. Jim Vaughter set up our meeting with John Mills. Mills acts as a historian for the 306th in England.

In the absence of an Amer service man being in England on Oct 14, John Mills places the wreath at the memorial headstone for the 306th. By coincidence our trip placed us in England for this ceremony. So John Mills delegated this honor to me. Have to admit it left me with a lot of sad memories, a lump in my throat and tears in my eyes.

Never in my wildest dreams did I ever think I would have this honor bestowed on ME, 42 years after being shot down and taken prisoner.

Everyone in England treated us as if we were Royalty - when they found out we were Americans that fought during the war.

When we arrived in London, my luggage failed

to get off the plane and went on to Brussels. When the woman at the inn where we stayed found out about my luggage - she got on the phone, told the air line to get my luggage and delivered it to where we were staying. - 2 days later I had my luggage.

Another day we were in a Pub at Herrods (all Pubs close at 3pm - open again at 6 or 7pm) The proprietor asked all customers to leave - turned to my brother-in-law & I and said "you two can stay as long as you want" then sat down to talk to us.

The air base we used in 1943 is now under tight security - but we received special clearance to get on the base - thanks to the effort of many wonderful people.

My brother-in-law took my copy of your book to read. (That was prior to Sept 25th - still in his possession) Today he called to ask a question - had friends with him and used your book as a reference - then apologized he hadn't returned it to me. — So, I, decided he should have his own copy - and I knew you would be willing to fill this order for me - by sending him his own copy.

John Mills of Bedford England has asked Pierre to place the SSMA wreath at Madingley Cemetery, on Oct 13, 1985. (Oct 14, 1943 was the day 600 men were shot down on the Schweinfurt Raid.)
