He was united in marriage to Leona Oulman on July 4, 1946 in Sioux Falls.

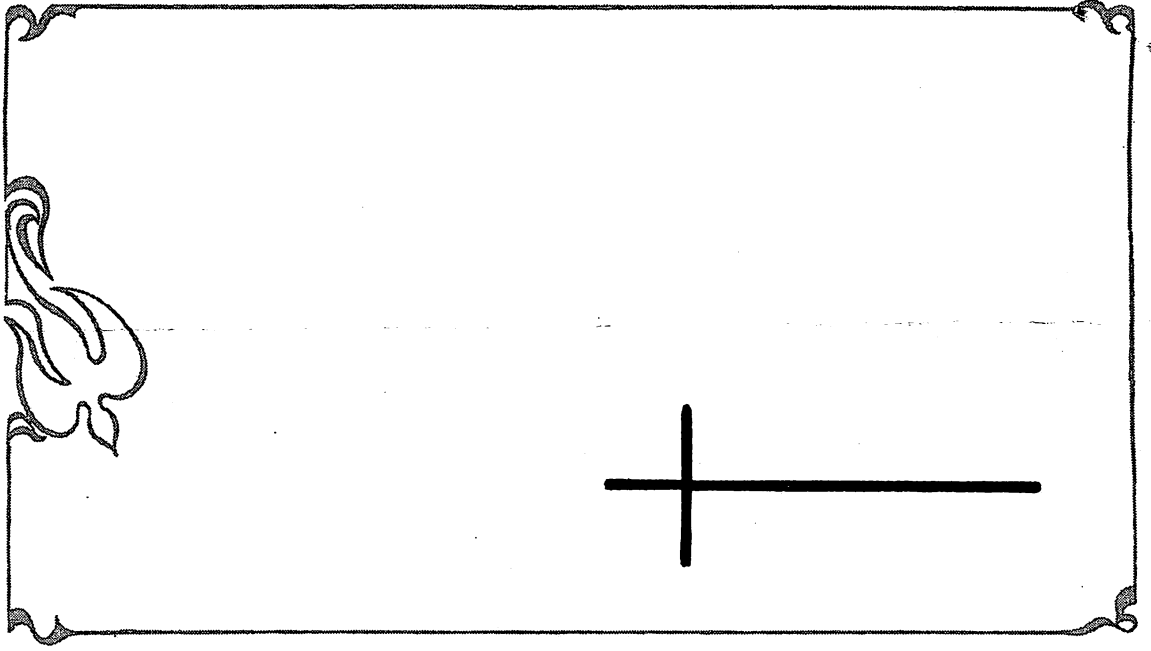
Mr. Rohrer joined the Army Air Corp during WW II. He belonged to the 306th Bomber Group. Louis was a gunner on B-24, B-17 and B-26 bombers. He flew on 123 missions. He was honorably discharged in 1945. He then worked for Dan Dugan as a transport driver for 32 years from 1949 to 1981.

He loved golfing and fishing.

Louis was a member of Sunnycrest United Methodist Church, was a lifetime member of the V.F.W., Military Order of the Cooties, Seam Squirrel of Cooties, from 1977 to 1978 State Commander, 1990 to present was Grand Quartermaster for State of South Dakota, and volunteer at VA Hospital for 13 years as a driver.
