- II-MARKING OF CLOTHING. 1. Rescission: Sec IV, Cir 5, 20 Jan 1944, is rescinded.
 2. Marking Specifications. Officers and enlisted men's clothing will be plainly marked with the owner's last name, first name, middle initial (if any) and serial number, in the following manner:

DOE, JOHN B. COE BROWN, CHARLES H.
 O-361285 36182831

Unit designation, rank or grade will not be shown. The marking will be done with indelible laundry marking ink in a neat, legible manner, with letters approximately 1/2" high. Marking ink may be requisitioned from the nearest Class II Quartermaster Depot on the basis of one pint per 250 men.

3. Articles to be Marked. Articles will be marked as indicated:

- Caps and hats-----Inside on sweat band, next to the cap or hat.
- Dressers-----Inside on right waist band.
- Jackets, field, MHT, etc.-----Inside, just below center of the collar.
- Shirts, cd-----Inside, just below center of the collar.
- Trousers (wool, cd, MHT, etc)-----Inside on right waist band.
- Suits, MHT, etc-----Inside, just below center of collar.
- Undershirts-----Inside, on back of neck.
- Leggins-----Inside, at top portion of calf.
- Shoes-----Inside, about 1/2" from the top.
- Handkerchiefs-----In one corner.
- Towels-----In one corner.
- Socks-----Outside, toward the top. (Top of the socks should be spread during marking.)

Neckties-----In the center on small part of tie.

4. Laundry Marks or Tags. Laundry marks or tags currently used in the UK will not be removed. All other laundry tags will be removed and marks will be obliterated by lining through. Clothing turned in for salvage will have all marks removed or lined through.
