TELETYPE FROM 8TH AIR FORCE FOR INFORMATION OF ALL PERSONNEL.

QUOTE:

Enemy aircraft spotted twice once at 0034 hrs 8 miles east of Burridge and 8 minutes later ten miles west of Burridge. There are grounds for believing that Enemy agents have been dropped. Three descriptions have been given of one suspected agent one: about 6 foot spoke English well, very overcoat and what appeared to be a Haversack on shoulder two: 6 foot round shaped hat similar to fatigue hat worn by 3 Soldiers greenish overall suit and Haversack three: 5 foot 9 inches thin build, belted Mackintosh dark trilby hat about thirty years old Haversack. Was challenged by an A.M.C. Officer and a Patrol at Newey Hill four miles southwest of Burridge at 2000 hours 25 Feb 44. No run across the downs in a south-east direction toward Everleigh Ashes. Intensified search requested. Burridge located in Wilts south of Marlborough.
