3. BUSINESS TRANSACTIONS WITH GERMAN BANKS PROHIBITED:

PAR 1 AND 2-161-G is quoted for the information of all members this station: Pursuant to aath received from higher Hq, off immediately, U.S. Military personnel and civilians accompanying or serving with the Armed Forces who are subject to U. S. Military law are prohibited from entering premises of or engaging in business with or having any financial transaction with, any German Bank (Reichsbank) or similar German institution, or employing the services of others in this respect. This prohibition specifically includes the exchange or conversion of currencies at or with such agencies. The foregoing does not apply to Finance Dept, Military Govt, or other personnel in the performance of official duties. Appropriate disciplinary action will be taken against offenders. Inform all personnel.

SUGGESTION: "The redeployment of men back to the US has left some ratings open. Now, why is it that men who step into their places cannot be given the ratings that are open.
