What I would like to know is who are the University courses open to, and who is eligible to make one of the trips that are now being planned."

SUGGESTION: "Why is it that only those men who are casuals, or rather those who have nothing to do at the present time, are given all the opportunities to participate in many of the activities that are now offered to men in the ETO? Those of us who have done our job well for the past 3 1/2 months over here are given little chance to take advantage of the University courses, and the various trips to different parts of the country. It seems to me and many others that the most deserving men are the very ones who are denied the right to take advantage of these opportunities."

ANSWER: The University courses and sightseeing trips to other countries (EAE program) was designed for non-operational units "scooting out" redeployment and occupational units. At the present time this group is operational. When our mission is completed and the group becomes OAF, it is hoped that all qualified personnel will be given opportunity for University courses, etc. In the meantime, take advantage of our airplane trips to Scotland and southern England, as well as truck trips to surrounding places of interest.
