SUGGESTION BOX

Suggestion:

"As it has been in the past and more so now, the planes that fly non-operational flights, particularly over the Continent seemed to be over burdened with female personnel (WAC's) and personnel not on this Station. Many ground men who have put forth every effort in the past 2½ years to send the planes out, would like to go on such a trip, to see some of the bomb damage from the air and the Continent. That is grossly unfair to the ground men of this Station to go to other units off the post to get passengers. Why not offer the boys right here a ride over? Many want to go including myself. But there is a lack of organization in making known to the men of the Station that such flights are being made. Like other instances, particularly awards and decorations information, the men are in the dark.

"Why not give the boys here at home the first chance on a free ride? They have strove hard for the past 2½ years through faithful and unregarded service to press the attack from the air. Give the boys a chance, then the WACs and other non-station personnel."

Answer:

"Non-station personnel are carried on the trips you mention by orders of higher authority. However, as for you and other ground personnel of the Station, you do come first--furthermore, SB agrees with you some one has fallen down on the job in not letting you know how to get a ride. Here's how to get on the list: get your CO's permission to make the trip then report in person or by phone to Group Operations, and a trip for you will be arranged.
