ATTENTION: The following TWX from 1st Air Division is quoted for the information of all concerned: "Quoted for your immediate action is message S-21643, 6 Sep 45, received from CG USMPT: QUOTE Following cable received from MD, Reference number WX-69042: 'Desired that military personnel prior departure your command be indoctrinated in pertinent uniform regulations, military discipline and customs of the service and necessity for strict compliance therewith. Proper wearing of the uniform should receive particular attention. Strict compliance by returnees necessary to insure best prestige and desired public relation'. UNQUOTE. Commanders of all cobbins will take immediate action to insure compliance with the foregoing within 48 hours of receipt of this message".
