3. NOTICE: Following letter from HQ USAF, Subj: "Security of Classified Information", dd 8 Sep 45, is quoted for info and strict compliance of all personnel:
"1. Instances of unauthorized divulgence of classified information have recently occurred. These incidents have created unwarranted difficulties and undesirable situations. They indicate the need for positive reaffirmation of the provisions of AF 330-5(Safeguarding Military Information).
2. In view of the proposed relocation of provisions of military censorship regulations, it is vital that commanders bring to the immediate attention of all their units and agencies, the basic regulation which prohibits, and will continue to prohibit, divulging of classified information to persons other than those official duties require such information. This prohibition applies equally to divulging classified information to members of the press." BY CAPT CO. 2D BATTALION CEN.
