SUBJECT: Intelligence Report. Mission: Gessertshausen, 16 March, 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H).

1. Narrative

17 A/C of the 306th Group plus one PFF flew Lead Group of the 40th "A" Combat Wing and 7 A/C of the 306th Group flew as lead squadron of the low group of the 40th "A" Combat Wing. Take off was at 0800 hours. Crossing the English Coast at Beachy Head at 0943 hrs. and the enemy coast at 5000N x 0115E at 1002 hrs, the briefed course was followed to 4750N x 1030E. At this point an approach to the target was made. PFF crew, attempting to pick up secondary, got Gessertshausen in screen and dropped bombs there at 1207 hrs. on a heading of 53 degrees magnetic for the lead group and 58 degrees magnetic for the low group. After the target, at 4817N x 1030E this group made a 360-degree turn to let other groups catch up and then came out over the prescribed route except for a variation of five to ten miles to the north from Compiègne forest to Abbeville. The French Coast was crossed at Le Treport at 1447 hrs. and the English Coast at 5050N x 0025E at 1509 hrs. Base was reached at 1613 hrs.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No fighter opposition was encountered by this group, and we make no claims. Four E/A, including one T/E, were observed in the distance in the target area, the T/E firing rockets with no observed results. These E/A were attacked by P-51s and driven into the clouds. Both Lead and Low Groups report good cover most of the way, but both report gaps. The gap for the low group occurred for about 20 minutes just before the I.P. when they were not covered by the P-38s that should have been there, but the lead group saw a few P-38s. After the target the lead group saw no escort until they reached approximately 7 degrees east, after which the support was as scheduled. The low group reports escort as briefed after the target, at which time they were behind the lead group. Several crews report that Spitfire cover was better and closer than usual.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

No flak was encountered by this group in the target area, but a barrage was observed after we had passed by. The route in was clear, but on the way out meager to moderate, accurate, tracking flak was experienced from Compiègne Forest, Montidier, Poix and Abbeville. No unusual flak phenomena was observed.

4. Bombing

Bombs were dropped on PFF A/C leading 40th "A" Combat Wing. 10/10 cloud cover made observation of results impossible, but several crews report columns of smoke rising above the undercast. PFF crew reports that bombs were dropped on Gessertshausen, 6 miles S.W. of Augsburg.

5. Leaflets

50 parcels of U.S.G. 26's were dropped by our A/C #897-S, pilot Clark at bombs away, probably at Gessertshausen.

6. Weather

Cloud cover was from 8/10 to 10/10 in the target area. Over most of France the cover was 6/10 to 8/10, probably making A/C occasionally visible to anti-aircraft gunners.

7. A/C in Distress

1156 hrs., between I.P. and target, B-17, from formation to left, heading for Switzerland, under control, with two engines feathered.

8. A/C Taking Off, Not Dispatched

A/C 113, pilot Ehrler, turned back at 0850 hrs. over Poddington with number 2 prop governor out. Returned 10 x 500.

A/C 444, pilot Love turned back at 0855 hrs. over Poddington, because of leak in oxygen system. Returned 10 x 500.

A/C 969, pilot Haywood, turned back at 0926 hrs. at Splasher #10 with oxygen system out in tail, left waist and radio positions. Returned 38 parcels of Frags.

9. A/C Dispatched, Returning Early

5 A/C, constituting the Low Squadron of the Low Group (A/C #196 pilot Hilton, 700 pilot Tripp, 382 pilot Dowell, 155 pilot Rehn, and 726 pilot Malsom) turned back as a squadron at 1014 hrs. at 4940N - 0150E. This squadron, in climb through clouds over Poddington and from there to the coast lost the Combat Wing and was unable to catch up. This squadron kept on until a point about forty miles inland when they saw it would be impossible to catch up and so turned back in lieu of going in further alone. These five A/C brought back a total of 190 parcels of Frags.

NOTE: Our A/C #942, pilot Mack, was severely damaged on the bomb run when fragmentation clusters from our A/C #042, pilot Jacobs and #758, pilot Smith, caught in the slipstream and hit Lt. Mack's wings.

NAZI MYSTERY SEEN IN BIG BATTLES

BERLIN went off the air last night after probably the greatest 24 hours air offensive of the war.

Very strong forces of American "heavies" bombed targets in Southern Germany in daylight after the R.A.F. had carried out the biggest raid of the war on Stuttgart on Wednesday night.

The Germans sent up a mystery plane, night fighters and a fighter firing rockets from its tail to attack the Americans. The mystery aircraft was a twin-engine plane with four engines. None of the pilots who saw it could identify it.

Up to an early hour today United States H.Q. over here had not disclosed yesterday's objectives. The Germans said, they were:—

AUGSBURG, home of the great M.A.N. air and submarine works, and **ULM**, minor manufacturing town on the Danube.

But last night's American communiqué disclosed that Fortresses and Liberators in very great strength, escorted and supported by very strong forces of Lightnings, Thunderbolts and Mustangs, and by Dominion and Allied Spitfires, were sent to strike at industrial objectives.

All targets were bombed though overcast by the use of instruments.

Enemy fighter opposition was determined, and the fighters destroyed 76 enemy aircraft in aerial combat.

Forts 'Blew Up'

The number of enemy fighters shot down by the bombers is not yet available.

Twenty-two bombers and 13 fighters are missing.

Some Forts, hit by rockets, blew up in the middle of the formation.

Others which were only slightly damaged, were "killed" when they dropped from under the protecting guns of the rest of the formation.

One airman said: "The ships that straggled had hell beat out of them. I saw at least three Forts go down that way."

Biggest Night Raid

In the greatest night raid ever more than 1,000 heavy R.A.F. bombers dropped more than 3,000 tons of bombs on German targets on Wednesday night.

Stuttgart was the main target for the R.A.F. Lancasters and Halifaxes.

It is likely that well over 2,500 tons of the 3,000 were dropped on this important German war centre with its extensive engineering industry.

Diversionsary targets were Munich and Amiens in France. The German night fighter defences were stretched to the utmost.

The loss of 40 aircraft on an operation of such magnitude was not excessive.

up their rocket attacks with close-range thrusts by cannon-firing single-engine fighters. Some rocket-planes were in units of as many as 40, gunners said.

Although some bombardiers reported breaks in the curtain of clouds overhanging the entire continent, bombing was carried out with the "through clouds" technique.

Berlin radio's evening news broadcast said that both Augsburg and Ulm were hit by the daylight bombers, and "in both towns bombs fell on densely-populated residential areas and there were many casualties among the civilian population."

After repeating those usual claims, the broadcast once again referred to "bad weather" as an excuse for the failure of Luftwaffe formations to keep the attackers from their targets.

An official communiqué issued in Switzerland reported last night that seven U.S. bombers had come down on Swiss territory, three of them in crash landings. One airman was reported killed, two others wounded and the entire crew of one plane could not be found.

Returning crews reported enemy fighters attacking some formations in large numbers.

Fire and smoke were reported at some of the day's targets by crews flying over breaks in the clouds. The same breaks also confirmed, in part, German claims that their fighters were snowbound.

2/Lt. Robert W. Wood, of Columbia, Ohio, pilot of the B17 Daring Doris, said 40 fighters attacked his formation with rockets. At least 150 to 200 were encountered over enemy territory on the entire mission, according to Wood.

The daring tactics of some formations of Luftwaffe fighters were relayed by T/Sgt. Kirk O. Wels, of Brainerd, Minn., a B17 radio operator.

"The Jerries showed some of their old fight today but never while our escort was

there," he said. "A few hundred attacked in tens, blazing away from head-on and snap-rolling through the formation."

1/Lt. Quince L. Brown, of Bristow, Okla., an Eighth P47 pilot, became the third pilot of the Eighth Air Force to claim four German fighters in one operation.

Brown brought down three of the Luftwaffe planes in the air and destroyed one on the ground. He also claimed to have damaged two others on the ground. The other two four-in-one pilots are Capt. Don S. Gentile, P51 pilot from Piqua, Ohio, and 1/Lt. James M. Morris, of Detroit, who shot down his four Jerries while flying a P38.

The first plane claimed by Brown was an Me109 which was trying to land at a German base. He shot it down when the German pilot was no more than 20 feet off the landing strip. The Oklahoman destroyed a Ju88 on the ground at the same field. Later he brought down one of two FW190s which he engaged in a dogfight and shortly before heading for home he got his last, another Me109.

Lt. Jack R. Warren, an Eighth P51 pilot from San Jacinto, Cal., claimed three German planes yesterday.

Another claim for three enemy aircraft destroyed was put in by 2/Lt. William J. Simmons, of Los Angeles, a Ninth Air Force Mustang pilot in the group commanded by Lt. Col. James Howard. Simmons reported he got three enemy craft in 30 seconds, possibly a record. He jumped two FW190s just after his engine had momentarily developed trouble, destroyed them both and then went on down to get an Me109.

Lt. Col. Thomas Conroy, of Douglas, Ariz., flying in the B24 Fighting Sam, reported enemy aircraft taking oil on a field below his formation as they were about to cross out over the Channel. A formation of P47s dived on the hapless German fighters and scattered them.
