TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

306th flew "A" CBW complete. Following rendezvous in thick weather, Wing left Selsey Bill in formation and flew approximately briefed course for balance of mission. Crossed French Coast at 1836 hours. Short of I.P., formation dropped 1,000 feet to get under cloud, and bombed as follows: Lead group at 19,000 feet at 1934 hours, 110 degrees mag. heading; Low group at 18,000 feet at 1935 hours, 99 degrees mag; High group at 21,000 feet 1935 hours, 110 degrees mag. Crossed French Coast back at 2039 hours, Beachy Head at 2100 hours. Landed at base at 2208 hours. 306th also flew the High group in 40th "C" CBW. Made rendezvous and flew with wing throughout. Bombed at 2001 hours, at 18,000 feet, 103 degrees mag. heading. A/C 611-G, pilot McNeil, left formation over Channel, engine trouble. Later joined 92nd Bomb Group, bombing Romilly-sur-Seine. Landed at Challey, near Brighton.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

There was no E/A opposition. There was good escort throughout. Chiefly P47s before Target, P38s and P51s afterward.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

Meagre and inaccurate A.A. fire from Romilly.

4. Bombing

Photographs show bombs of each of 3 groups in "A" CBW and high group in "C" CBW all directly on MPI. Smoke obscuring bridge makes assessment of damage impossible at this time.

5. Nickels

None carried.

6. Weather

10/10ths and heavy contrails over England. 6 to 10/10ths over Channel, tops about 12,000 feet, generally clear over Continent, except for patch of cloud at altitude which necessitated dropping 1,000 feet to bomb.

7. Observations

Marshalling yards at 4844N x 0355E, Chateau Thierry Lesbordies, Forges and Bellegarde all fairly well choked with traffic.

8. Aircraft Returning Early

A/C 181-B, pilot Butterff and A/C 946-T, pilot D.C. Allen, both spares, finding no positions to fill, turned back as briefed. Each brought back 2 x 2000.
A/C 454-B, pilot Breslin, turned back over Splasher 11 with mechanical trouble. Returned 2 x 2000.

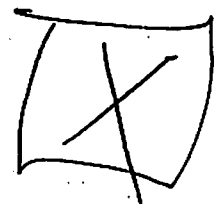

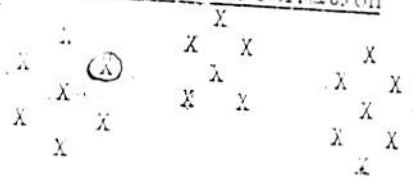

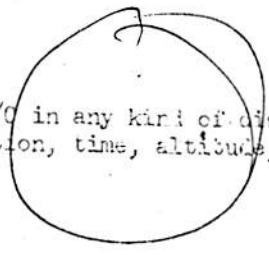
