SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative
Mission: Munich

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H)

1. Narrative

The 306th Group flew 34 A/C plus 2 PFF as the 40th "A" CBW. The route was flown as briefed. They left the English Coast at Clacton at 1031g hours; Enemy Coast was crossed at 1105 hours, at 5152N x 0352E; I.P. at 1245 hours; Target at 1253 hours; Enemy Coast on way out at 1542 hours at 5152N x 0352E; English Coast at 1628 hours, at 5150N x 0115E; Landed at Base at 1730 hours.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No E/A were seen. P-51's provided close support, first appearing at 1137 hours, southeast of Aachen; then at 1159 hours, continuing over target and on way out. P-47's at 1400 hours, remained till past enemy coast. One crew member stated "support best I've seen". P-51's were all over like swarms of bees. No gaps in the fighter support. Some crew members saw as many as 35 P-51's at one time.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

There was no A.A. gun fire except at target. Meager but accurate tracking fire at 40th "A" CBW, first over primary, was reported becoming more intense, both tracking and barrage, as groups following came over the target. Damage to our A/C; 1 severe, 8 minor, all on lead and high groups. Bursts breaking into chaff stream behind formation.

4. Bombing

Due to failure of special equipment, lead PFF A/C turned over the lead to the deputy lead A/C #748, just before the I.P., resuming the lead after turn off target. Bombing was PFF through solid undercast, with results unobserved. Intensity and position of A.A. gun fire thrown at following wings indicated almost certain location of PFF primary area. Pictures show solid cloud.

5. Nickels

A/C #600-G, dropped 10 x XG-16, and A/C #611-G, dropped 10 x XG-13, at 1253 hours on the PFF Primary.

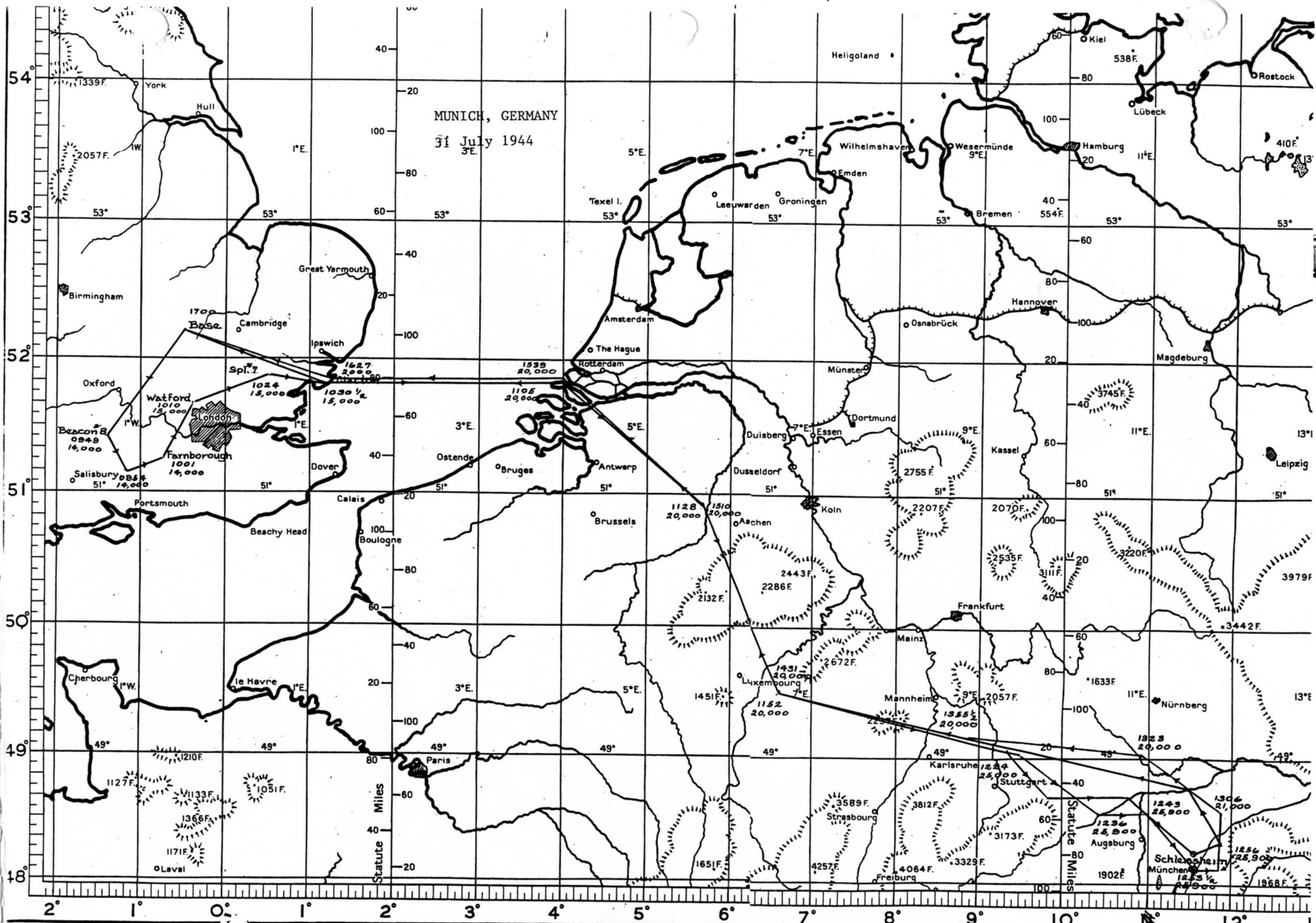
6. Weather

7 to 10/10ths cloud over route. In the target area tops were 22,000 to 25,000 feet, with cirrus at 25,000 feet. Bombing was at 26,000 feet. Contrails below 26,000 feet.

7. A/C Returning Early

A/C #017-Z, pilot Schoenbacher turned back, at 0907 hours, at 5242N x 0130W, due to mechanical failure. A/C #454-B, pilot Christianson turned back, at 1040 hours, at 5150N x 0220E, with supercharger out.

Spare A/C #301-U turned back as briefed at 1102 hours at 5147N x 0310E.

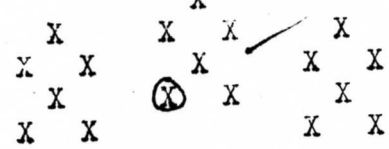

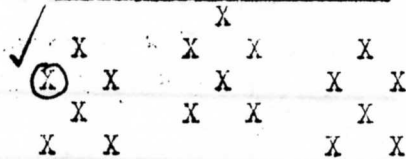
