SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative,  
Mission: Leipzig, Germany.

TO : Commanding Officer, 306th Bombardment Group (H).

1. Narrative

The 306th Group flew lead and low groups in 40th CBW. Rendezvous and assembly were complicated by both rain and thick cloud above 6,000 feet, and assembly, in spite of poor visibility, was eventually made below this level. CBW left English Coast about 20 miles North of course at 0722 hours. Over the Channel clouds broke and CBW flew approximately briefed course to 13 degrees East, crossing Enemy coast at 5240N x 0438E at 0806 hours. Swung south of briefed I.P. for bomb run on primary on heading of 299 degrees for lead group at 1012 hours, 300 degrees for low group at 1014 hours, high group failing to bomb but going on to bomb briefed visual secondary. Briefed turn off target successfully avoided most of Leipzig flak. CBW leader "S'd" over visual secondary to allow high group to rejoin formation after bombing, then returned to Base approximately as briefed. Enemy coast at 5247N x 0438E at 1204 hours, Base at 1330 hours.

2. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No attacks on this group. P-47's supported from Dutch Coast to I.P. A few P-38's were seen in Target area. No escort was then observed until 15 minutes after target, when P-38's again appeared and stayed to Channel.

3. A.A. Gun Fire

The only A.A. Gun Fire on this group was at Leipzig, where it was moderate to intense barrage fire, mostly inaccurate, with some tracking for about 5 minutes after the turn off Target. Crews believe chaff caused barrage to be low. Bulk of barrage covered city area, to the west of this group's target and course. Of 32 A/C over the Continent, 3 suffered slight damage, 5 severe. In Dummer Lake region, no AA gun fire was fired at this formation, nor was any observed.

4. Bombing

The 306th lead and low were the last to bomb, thus on the bomb run, ground haze and smoke from previous bombing in the same general area obscured target and made precision work difficult. One minute before bombs away, another Group came from the left directly across our course. Pictures show lead group bombs at 065078/6. Low group bombardier was unable to identify target with certainty making a run and hitting buildings which he thought were the target. High Group (305th) did not bomb, dropping out of formation to bomb briefed visual secondary on way back. Crews report smoke from bombing all over Leipzig area, a column of black smoke higher than Hamburg coming from center of town.

5. Nickels

A/C 737-U dropped 3 G-22's on the primary target.

6. Weather

Rain and solid overcast over England with visibility down to 2 miles, made rendezvous difficult and compelled descent below 10,000 feet for assembly. Clear over Continent except for haze in Target area.

7. Observations

Smoke screens at Leipzig, Berlin, Magdeburg, Halberstadt and Celle.

22 A/C seen at A/F on East side of Leipzig.

25 A/C on A/F NW of Stendal.

10 A/C on A/F at Brandenburg.

18 A/C on A/F at Salzwedel.

10 A/C on A/F at Vechta.

A/D at 5243N x 0616E. Concrete runway. Photo taken.

A/D at 5059N x 1231E. 3 A/C seen.

Long runways in woods at 5230N x 1140E.

8. A/C Returning Early

A/C 196-D, pilot Lingwall turned back at 0728 hours at 5202N x 0200E.

Could not find formation. Brought back 10 x 500.

A/C 616-X, pilot Winword, turned back at 0750 hours at 5230N x 0250E.

Could not find formation. Brought back 10 x 500.

A/C 963-P, pilot Neddo turned back at 0823 hours at 5247N x 0538E, because of supercharger failure. Jettisoned 10 x 500 in field at point of turnback.

A/C 053-U, pilot McAllister, turned back at 0921 hours at 5237N x 0705E., after #4 engine went out, pilot was unable to feather prop. Jettisoned 10 x 500 in Zuider Zee.

Spare A/C Returning Early

A/C 669-G, pilot Kata, and A/C 503-W, pilot Horn, flying spares, turned back at 0745 hours at approximately 0300E as briefed, not having found vacancies in formation.

A/C In Distress

During assembly 2 B-17's seen to collide. One exploded in air, the other on hitting ground. 0700 hours, at 5215N x 0025E.

1 chute seen over Target at about 12,000 feet.

B-17 seen flying at about 500 feet over deck at 1220 hours at 5230N x 0300E (DR position) heading 245 degrees. In no apparent distress. Saw launch 15 miles W.S.W. heading toward it. (Phoned to Division at 1450).

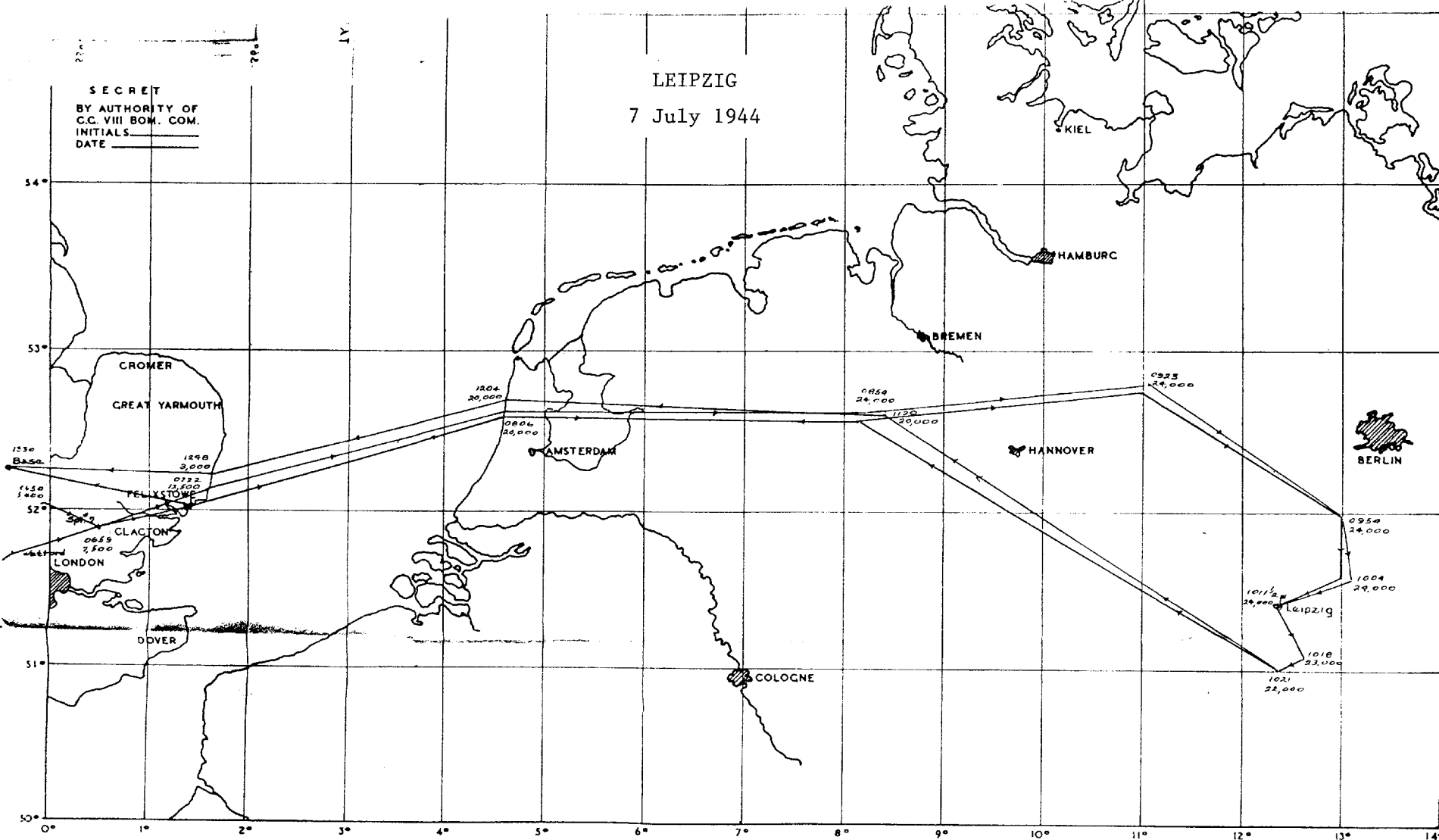
A/C believed to be a fighter, seen going down in flames at 5240N x 0438E., at 0805 hours.

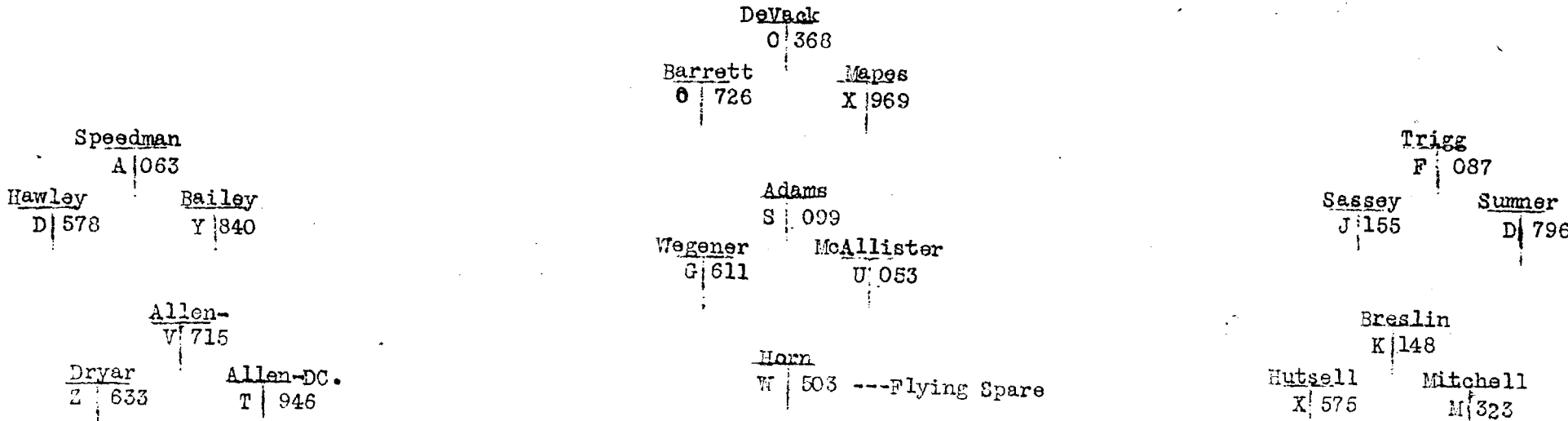

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## 114 Nazi Aircraft KO'd As Heavies Batter Reich

### Bulletin

WASHINGTON, July 7—U.S. B29 Super-Fortresses returned to Japan to night and bombed the naval base at Sasebo and industrial objectives at Yawata. Both cities are on Kyushu, most southerly of the greater islands of Japan proper.

The second strike against Japan by the huge bombers was announced in a brief communique from Gen. Henry H. Arnold, head of the U.S. Army Air Forces and of the 20th Air Force, under which the Super-Forts operate. No details of the raid were forthcoming immediately.

Yawata, the heart of Japan's steel industry, was a target of the B29's initial raid June 15.

## 2 Statesmen Go To Sea in Privy

Two Republican congressmen reached London yesterday on a first-hand inspection of the U.S. merchant marine that was really first-hand—they worked their way across the Atlantic on a tanker filled with high-octane gasoline.

"We worked like hell," related Rep. Gordon Canfield, of Paterson, N.J. "We got up each day just before six, made up 20 bunks, then swabbed galleys and rooms with slop buckets, cleaned privies and polished brass until evening. I even worked in the engine room as a wiper at 180 degrees temperature."

Canfield was aft utility man and Rep. Hugh D. Scott Jr., of Philadelphia, was midships utility man. They worked in khaki trousers and undershirts and slept in the forecabin with the seamen. No one aboard knew their identity.

In London they talked to scores of soldiers and WACs at the ARC Mostyn Club and heard first-hand accounts of the robot bombs.

Canfield, a member of the House Merchant Marine Committee, and Scott, a member of the House Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee, said they made the trip with the authorization of the Speaker to provide information on the merchant marine for Congress and the War Shipping Administration.

## Nazis Attacking

## Biggest Sky Battle Since D-Day Hits Luftwaffe Hard

One hundred and fourteen Nazi aircraft were shot out of the sky yesterday as more than 1,100 escorted U.S. heavy bombers flew through swarms of German interceptors to batter more than seven vital targets deep in the Reich.

After a day in which more than 6,000 tons of explosives were dropped on robot nests in France in five savage Allied assaults, a near-record force of Fortresses and Liberators thundered to Germany itself to smash at Nazi aircraft and oil production.

The skies over Germany were alive with battling fighters in the first major battle since D-Day. Escorting P47s, 38s and 51s knocked down 75 German planes; 39 fell to the guns of the heavies.

### 36 Heavies are Lost

Cost of the shattering blow was 36 bombers and eight pursuits.

At the same time, in another clear demonstration of Allied air superiority, up to 500 Italian-based heavy bombers, presumably American, attacked oil installations at Odertal, in German Silesia, 67 miles southeast of Breslau.

The brunt of Luftwaffe opposition yesterday was borne by Liberator formations, the Fortresses meeting only slight resistance. One B24 combat wing was attacked by more than 100 German fighters, and other Liberator formations reported savage attacks by up to 75 interceptors.

Targets of the bombers were fighter-components assembly plants at Moekau, near Leipzig; bomber-assembly plants at Mallo, Bernburg and Aschersleben, and synthetic oil plants at Lutzkendorf and Bohlen, as well as an oil refinery at Morseburg.

Hundreds of enemy planes rose to pro-

## Here's Statement By Gen. Ike After Visit to Normandy

General Eisenhower, on his return to Britain from the Normandy front, issued a statement regarding the fighting there.
