SUBJECT: Intelligence Narrative
Mission: Ruhland

TO : Commanding Officer, 30th Bombardment Group (I)

1. Narrative

30th flew 33 A/C plus 3 PFF as 40th "b". Route to target was substantially as briefed. Navigators praised the lead for his meticulous work in avoiding flak concentrations along the route, especially in the narrow Osnabrück, Münster, Bielefeld corridor. Route of lead: English coast, 52°08'N-013°E, 0719 hours; Dutch coast, 52°37'N-043°E, 1013 hours; midland, briefed primary, 1249 hours. Lead and low flew east of Dresden, south of Chemnitz; Annaberg; resumed course at Gera; left enemy coast 52°37'N-043°E, 1448 hours; English coast, 52°32'N-011°E, 1517; base, 1602. High squadron went over primary but was unable to pick up aiming point, returned to course; tried to bomb secondary and last resort, turned north and bombed Rositz at 1532; back on course; enemy coast 52°55'N-011°E; base 1630.

2. PFF

The three PFF A/C flown were used only as navigational aids. Operators report good returns from briefed PFF target but very poor and indistinct returns from visual target.

3. Fighter Opposition and Fighter Support

No attacks. Three S/S jet propelled planes were seen in the Leipzig area. were climbing at very steep angle and left three distinct intermittent contrails, each about one half mile long. They climbed to estimated 40,000 feet and were in view of formation for about five minutes.

Fighter Support: Good on way in with P-51's picked up at 1016, 5238N-0450E. Fighters left near target after Buckeye Red reported bandits and were not seen on way out.

4. A. A. Gun Fire

Flak at Ruhland was meager to moderate tracking, low before bombs away and gradually coming up to altitude. Meager accurate tracking flak from outskirts of Osnabrück. Damage - 5 slight, 4 severe.

5. Ic. Wins

40 "b" lead and low squadrons attacked the primary target, midland, one visual run. Target obscured by very dense haze and low cloud. Lead bombardier, unable to see aiming point, used visual references. Low bombardier, likewise, did not see target, and used visual references. Photos show lead bombs, probably on target area, low bombs slightly north at 063083/6. High squadron, failing to see either primary, secondary, or last resort due to intense haze and cloud coverage, bombed target of opportunity at Rositz, 5127N-1103E.

Front from south moving into target area fast as formation arrived. 3/10 clouds, tops 15,000 feet, obscuring target. Heavy ground haze. No contrails. Weather over channel on return was 10/10 with tops at 7,500 feet.





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
