London Service For Crash Dead

Plan Memorial Tuesday
For Gen. Andrews and
13 Others

A memorial service for Lt. Gen. Frank M. Andrews, Bishop Adna Wright Leonard and the 12 other officers and enlisted men who were killed last Monday when their plane crashed in Iceland will be held Tuesday noon in the Royal Military Chapel, Wellington Barracks, London.

The service will be conducted by Chaplain James L. Blakeney, chief chaplain in the ETO.

A similar ceremony will be held in Washington Tuesday for the crash victims, who were buried Saturday in the American section of the civilian cemetery in the Icelandic capital.
