1. 24 A/C took off at 1315 to bomb the airframe factory at Meaulte. The route flown was approximatley as ordered and the weather was clear with good visibility over the target. Fighter support was excellent and crews reported it an easy mission.
2. Good, target appeared to have received several direct hits causing large fires and huge clouds of smoke.
3. 1 - Dungeness at 1520 due to failure oxygen systems.
1 - Beachy Head at 1550 due to oil leak /1 engine.
4. Opposition was moderate less than 10 E/A being reported and attacks few. Other groups ap eared to be getting more spirited attacks from FW's. Several crews reported new tactics of skip bombing from one FW flying head-on into formation and releasing bomb about 300 yards ahead. 2 of our A/C were damaged from this type of attack.
5. Very moderate. Only a few inaccurate bursts were seen near target area.
6. 1 B-17 seen to blow up just before target - 2 chutes out.
1 B-17 seen hit over target going down under control - 1 chute out.





Diagram of attack:


